#### When to book your trip

Did you know that there are periods of the day where LATS is extremely busy? These periods occur first thing in the morning from 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., over the lunch hour from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., and also from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. These periods are what we refer to as 'peak periods' where we are the busiest and it can be hard for clients to get trips. If you are experiencing difficulty getting a trip during these periods, please plan your outings between 9:30 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. or from 1:15 p.m. to 3:15 p.m., instead.

We are open Monday and Tuesday evenings and take trips up to 8:30 p.m. on Monday evenings and 8:15 p.m. on Tuesday evenings. Wednesday and Thursday, we take trips until 6:00 p.m. and Friday until 5:30 p.m. We are open both Saturday and Sunday and take trips until 5:00 p.m. both days. Sunday afternoons are typically quiet so consider booking an outing on Sunday as well. With Spring just around the corner, Sunday afternoons would be a wonderful time for a walk around Telford Lake.

Remember to give yourself the time you need to get to your appointment on time. When booking, **book by the time you want to arrive** at your appointment to ensure you arrive on time.

As we are a shared-ride service, there may be other clients on the bus with you who get dropped off before you, so be sure to allow yourself enough time to get your errands done while out.

You can book trips up to ten days in advance now!



#### Call centre hours are as follows:

Monday to Friday - 5:00 a.m. to midnight Sat, Sun and Holidays – 6:00 a.m. to midnight

Remember – you can book your LATS rides up to 10 days in advance now so start making your plans and get out and about in Leduc!



Lay the wraps on a bread board and spread with the cream cheese. Layer the other ingredients of your choice on top of the cheese. Roll and slice. Enjoy!




